Los Angeles County Treasurer and Tax Collector Mails Notices of Payment(s) Due

ELIZABETH BUENROSTRO GINSBERG, Los Angeles County Treasurer and Tax Collector, mailed Payment Activity Notices to certain Los Angeles County property owners. The notices alert property owners that the Department's records reflect no payment, a partial payment, or a late payment on the first installment of property taxes for 2024-25. The notices include the attached insert which provides important information regarding payment options, office location, and service hours.

Mrs. Buenrostro Ginsberg advised, "As a result of this mailing, property owners may find it difficult to reach an agent on the telephone. However, property owners may view the 2024-25 Annual Secured Property Tax Bills, make online electronic check (eCheck) payments, or obtain tax payment history for the past three fiscal tax years on the Los Angeles County Property Tax Portal at property tax propertytax.lacounty.gov. Property owners may also submit inquiries at ttc.lacounty.gov/public-inquiries or call the toll-free Property Tax Information Line at 1(888) 807-2111, where automated information is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week."

Properties Impacted by Wildfires After January 6, 2025

For property owners impacted by wildfires, Governor Newsom signed Executive Orders suspending penalties, costs, and interest on late property tax payments for properties located in ZIP codes 90019, 90041, 90049, 90066, 90265, 90272, 90290, 90402, 91001, 91024, 91040, 91103, 91104, 91106, 91107, 91367, 93535, or 93536. However, the Executive Orders do not cover the first installment of the property taxes for 2024-25 which was due November 1, 2024, and became delinquent after December 10, 2024.

The Department is collaborating with the Office of the Assessor (Assessor) and other partner departments to expedite property tax disaster relief resources and information, including complying with applicable laws and EOs. The Department, in conjunction with the Assessor, released a statement regarding the wildfires and the April 10 secured

property tax deadline, a social media post regarding property tax deferral for impacted property owners, and a disaster relief informational packet at assessor.lacounty.gov/tax-relief/disaster-relief. Additionally, the Department's staff support disaster recovery centers in both Altadena and West Los Angeles.

This Payment Activity Notice is to alert you that our records reflect a penalty was imposed on the 1st installment of your property tax bill. The penalty was imposed for one or more of the following reasons: no payment was received, a partial payment was received, or your 1st installment payment was received after the delinquency date. To avoid any additional penalties and/or cost, remit your payment by the April 10, 2025 delinquency date on the tax notice.

PAYMENT OPTIONS

PAYMENTS – We only accept U.S. currency drawn on U.S. based financial institutions.

PARTIAL PAYMENTS – We recommend you pay the total amount due. However, if you are unable to do so, we accept partial payments, which reduce the amount of penalties imposed.

PAY ONLINE – To make payments online, go to <u>propertytax.lacounty.gov</u> and select "Pay Property Taxes Online." You can make online payments 24 hours a day, 7 days a week up until 11:59 p.m. Pacific Time on the delinquency date. All online payment options provide immediate email confirmation. Please note that you cannot make online payments for installment plans (Four-Pay and Five-Pay Plans).

PAY BY ELECTRONIC CHECK – There is no cost to you for electronic check (eCheck) payments. The enclosed tax notice contains your Assessor's Identification Number (AIN), which you will need to complete the transaction. Each eCheck transaction is limited to \$2,500,000.00.

You may view a step-by-step video on how to make an eCheck payment at ttc.lacounty.gov/pay-your-property-taxes. The video is available in multiple languages.

When paying by eCheck, your bank account must be Automated Clearing House (ACH)-enabled, meaning the transaction can settle through the ACH Network. If your bank account has a debit block to prevent unauthorized organizations from debiting your account via ACH, you must notify your bank to authorize ACH debits from Los Angeles County with a debit filter with the Company Identification Number of 0000079161.

PAY BY CREDIT OR DEBIT CARD ONLINE – You may also pay online by using major credit cards or debit cards. Each online credit/debit card transaction is limited to \$99,999.99, including a cost, currently 2.22 percent of the transaction amount (minimum \$1.49 per transaction).

PAY BY CREDIT OR DEBIT CARD OVER THE TELEPHONE – We accept major credit and debit card payments over the telephone for current year taxes only. To pay by telephone, call toll-free 1(888) 473-0835. The enclosed tax notice contains your Assessor's Identification Number (AIN), Year, and Sequence, which you will need to complete the transaction. Each credit/debit card transaction is limited to \$99,999.99, including a cost, currently 2.22 percent of the transaction amount (minimum \$1.49 per transaction). Please note that you cannot make payments for defaulted taxes or installment plans (Four-Pay and Five-Pay Plans) over the telephone.

PAY BY MAIL – Please use the enclosed envelope(s) and include the payment stub from the tax notice. **If paying both installments, please include both payment stubs**. Do not mail cash or attach staples, clips, tape, or correspondence. You must mail property tax payments to the Los Angeles County Treasurer and Tax Collector, Post Office Box 54018, Los Angeles, CA 90054-0018. **Do not mail your payments to any other address**. Property tax payments must be received or United States Postal Service (USPS) postmarked by the delinquency date to avoid penalties. PAY IN PERSON – We accept cash, check, money order, cashier's check, and major credit cards and debit cards at 225 North Hill Street, First Floor Lobby, Los Angeles, CA 90012, between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Pacific Time, Monday through Friday, excluding Los Angeles County holidays. Each in-person credit/debit card transaction is limited to \$75,000.00, including a cost, currently 2.22 percent of the transaction amount (minimum \$1.49 per transaction).

ONLINE BANKING OR BILL PAYMENT SERVICES – We **DO NOT** recommend using these services to pay property taxes. The USPS does not postmark the envelopes these firms use to mail us the payment. In the absence of a postmark, we determine penalties based exclusively on the date we receive payment.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS

MILITARY ACTIVE DUTY EXEMPTIONS – Under provisions of the Federal Servicemembers Civil Relief Act, active military personnel, regardless of the duration of military service or financial status, may qualify for a reduction in the interest charged on unpaid property taxes. EMAIL NOTIFICATION SERVICE – You can subscribe to receive property tax related emails from the Treasurer and Tax Collector regarding special notices and upcoming events, such as annual property tax deadline reminders, office location updates and other news. To subscribe, visit **ttc.lacounty.gov/eNotify**.

VOLUNTARY THIRD PARTY NOTIFICATION PROGRAM – In the event your property becomes tax defaulted and/or subject to the tax collector's power to sell, you can designate a Third Party (e.g., a friend, family member, or agency) to receive copies of the default notices so that someone can remind you of your property tax obligation. To subscribe, visit ttc.lacounty.gov/third-party-property-tax-notification-program.

INSTALLMENT PLAN OPTION FOR DEFAULTED TAXES FROM A PRIOR YEAR – You may be eligible to open an Installment Plan of Redemption and pay the defaulted taxes over a five-year period for commercial properties or unimproved vacant residential lots that are less than three years in default, and residential or agricultural properties that are less than five years in default. The opening of the Installment Plan will prevent the properties from being sold at a public auction. For more information, visit ttc.lacounty.gov/property-tax-installment-plans.

REQUIREMENT FOR REGISTRATION OF TAX AGENTS

Any person who is employed, is under contract, or otherwise receives compensation to communicate directly, or through agents, employees or subcontractors, with any County official for the purpose of influencing official action, is required to register as a Tax Agent pursuant to County Code 2.165 under the Tax Agent Registration Program.
